The PIAA voted 25-5 in favor of moving forward with the start of Fall Sports as scheduled. Although this is an exciting news, there are still a number of questions to be answered. At this time, individual conferences/leagues and school boards will now have to make the final decisions as to if sports can proceed. For example, Harrisburg High School & Milton Hershey decided to opt out of fall sports. Other schools might follow. We are currently an independent school, thus, our schedules are dependent on other teams to play us. Therefore, our schedules are fluid and a final decision is still tentative regarding SJCA sports. At this time, we will continue to hold unofficial practices and I hope to have a definitive answer soon as to how SJCA will proceed.

Development & Advancement

This month we focus on one of our key donor programs, the Educational Improvement Tax Credit program. This program is very important for us in maintaining and growing our ability to provide tuition assistance to St. Joseph's students. Here are the specifics about the program for the 2020 Tax Year:

Individuals or Businesses may designate their state taxes that are owed to the PA Dept. of Revenue to St. Joseph's Catholic Academy for tuition assistance.

Who can participate?

- Individuals or businesses with a PA Tax Liability of at least \$3,500 may qualify to participate. See your 2019 Form PA-40 Line 12 for your PA Tax Liability amount.
- For individuals or couples (married filing jointly), one
 must work for a business, own a business or own stock in a company that does
 business in the state of Pennsylvania. Individuals may live outside of PA and still
 participate if they own such stock. You must have PA State Tax Liability.
- Retirees must own a small business (receive an annual K-1 form) or work for a
 business (receive and annual W-2 form) or own stock in a company that does
 business in the state of PA. Some retirees qualify due to side jobs or residual
 ownership of businesses and some do not. We can work with you to confirm



qualification status. Retirees may live outside of PA and still participate if they own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. You must have PA State Tax Liability.

Application Process and Recommended Timeline for the 2020 Tax Year:

- Communicate to Susan Robinson Fruchtl, Director of Development & Advancementat St. Joseph's Catholic Academy, that you would like to be an EITC Donor for St. Joseph's. Contact information is listed below.
- Complete the "Joinder" agreement form provided to you and return to Susan by **September 10, 2020**. Please **do not** send a check with the agreement form.
- Joinder will be forwarded to Tami Clark with the Central Pennsylvania Scholarship Fund (CPSF) by September 15, 2020.
- The CPSF will contact you via email if you have provided your email address when it receives your joinder agreement confirming it's receipt.
- Donor will receive a copy of the award letter from the Department of Community & Economic Development (DCED) most likely in October when the CPSF has been notified it has been awarded tax credits. This communication will also include information regarding your approval as an EITC donor to the CPSF.
- You will then send your capital contribution directly to the Special Purpose Entity
 (SPE) as stated in the letter from DCED so it arrives by the due date on the letter,
 typically November 15th. *Please note St. Joseph's Catholic Academy on the memo
 line of your check.
- Donor will receive the following tax documents from their partnership in the Special Purpose Entity in February/March 2021.
 - Schedule K-1 indicates the members share in the SPE and used when filing Federal and State Income Tax Return.
 - PA Department of Revenue form 1123 for the SPE this verifies that the tax credit exists for the SPE and the member's personal portion has been transferred to their Tax ID or Social Security Number when filing PA State Income Tax Return. **This is a copy for your records, CPSF files these with the state for you.**
- Donor (business or individual) will receive credit against your PA State Taxes for 90% of that amount each year you participate. This credit will be processed starting in July 2021. You should receive your tax credit by September/October of 2021.
- St. Joseph's Catholic Academy will receive 100% of the donor's contribution for tuition assistance.
- Susan will contact you about renewing your partnership for the 2021 tax year in the summer of 2021.

Our Humanity, Our Brokenness, and Our Longing for Affirmation

In last month's newsletter I argued that creating an environment where our students could grow into better human beings is essential to the mission of St. Joseph's. Human formation is also foundational to all Christian spirituality. Spiritual growth and human growth are never mutually exclusive. If I am growing spiritually then I am also growing as a human. My true humanity is precisely how God created me and it informs my relationship with those around me. And while it is nice to talk about human and spiritual growth, we all run the risk of never approaching our full human potential because



of our failure to address our own brokenness, or our own woundedness. This has nothing to do with a positive attitude, self-help, becoming a better professional, or even honing our professional skills. But, it has everything to do with addressing the fact that we are all broken in some way.

We are fired into this world by the breath of God and born in his image and likeness. As infants we lie in the arms of our parents and we are potential personified. We are truly human in every sense of the word. We are entirely affirmed and we are loved by God. But before long, our affirmation and love become increasingly dependent on those around us. We have all heard of the psychological and physiological studies that demonstrate how rapidly infants decline in health when they don't receive affection. In our infancy, this radical dependence on the nurturing love of those around is not our choosing. It is essential to our survival. But, before we know it we enter into our

developmental years and to one degree or another affirmation and love become something that we now seek out. We learn early on that we have some control over the affirmation that we receive, and we act accordingly while never realizing that what we are really pursuing is false affirmation.
