The WolfPack Student-Athletes, like many of their counterparts, were diligent in following health and safety guidelines while overcoming the many obstacles that they encountered during their fall campaigns.

#### Fall Sports Wrap-Up

Boys Cross Country had solid performances in their invitational meets, went 3-0 in dual meet competitions, and finished third at the District VI Championships. Jonah Clark (Senior) and Colin Simander (Freshman) were state qualifiers.

Girls Cross Country dominated their regular season events by winning three invitational meets (Red, White, and Blue; PIAA Foundation; TSTCA Championships) and earned a 3-0 dual meet record. The team finished second at the District VI championships. Kathleen Simander (Senior) was a state qualifier.

Golf earned a 9-5 mark on the season and, after a year hiatus, returned to the District VI post-season. Representing the boy's team was Dmitri Cornali (Junior), Nathan Cross (Senior), Timothy Peters (Sophomore), Brendan Scanlon (Senior), and Noah Straub (Senior). Brigid Scanlon (Sophomore) was a post-season qualifier from the girl's team.

Boys Soccer finished 5-7 during the regular season, earning them a second consecutive trip

to the District VI playoffs. Their post-season run ended with a heartbreaking 2-1 loss. Leading scorers on the year were Juniors Chris Forstmeier (Forward, 9) and Sam Yangula (Midfielder, 9).

Girls Soccer saw their two-year district qualifying run come to an end. However, they enjoyed a competitive season, played their best matches towards the end of the season, and led in a number of their games. Senior Clare Marsh (Forward) capped off her four-year career netting a school record, 77 goals.

Girls Volleyball playoff streak came to an end as well, but not without a fight. The young team, led by Morgan Wolf (Senior) and Madi Mazza (Junior), competed with a number of the region's best while coming within one win of a playoff berth.

Although we will be losing a number of senior leaders, all are teams will be returning strong nucleuses' next year. The future continues to look bright.

The Pack is grateful for the opportunities we had to compete this season and are thankful for everyone who helped along the way. The support, understanding, and encouragement was appreciated.
