The WolfPack has worked hard during the offseason, welcomed many newcomers, and the fall season is rolling along.



In their only two events to date, the Cross Country teams have opened the season, in strong fashion,

at the Red, White, and Blue Classic (RWB) held at White Oak Park & the Altoona Mt. Lion Invitational.

The boys placed two runners in the top 25 (RWB). They were led by Colin Simander (14th) and Josh Hyman (25th). In Altoona, the team was led by Colin S. (31st) and Josh H. (46th).

The girls opened their season with a second place finish (RWB) and followed it up with a 10th place finish (Altoona). They placed five runners in the top 30 at the RWB Classic. Amber Fisher (2nd), Evelyn Reynolds (6th), Kita Chappell (18th), Brandi Carmack (20th), and Abby Ridenour (26th). In Altoona, the team placed three in the top 50. Amber F. (8th), Kita C. (32nd), and Brandi C. (41st).

The Golf team finished 9-6 in the regular season and is looking to take their momentum into the post-season. Led by Timothy Peters (67) and Dmitri Cornali (87), the team finished second in the Sectional Tournament and look to complete for a district crown next week. Tim & Dmitri will have the opportunity to advance as individuals as well. Wins this season have come against East Juniata, Newport, Millersburg, Hollidaysburg, and Sugar Valley.

On the pitch, SJCA is sporting a coed Soccer team. The team has led in a

majority of their games and is very competitive but the bounces have not always been favorable. The team currently sits at 2-5. Chris Forstmeier and Luke Surovec lead the team in goals scored on the young season.

On the hardwood, the Girls Volleyball team has started the season 0-3. Seniors, Madi Mazza, Car Burwell, and Grace Rose lead a team full of freshman and sophomores. The team is learning quickly, working hard, and fun to watch.

Turn Your Pennsylvania Tax Payments Into Scholarships for Saint Joe's Students – Time is Running Out to Participate in the Fall 2021 Cycle – Contact Us Now to See if Tax Credits Still Remain!

Through this program businesses and individuals working in Pennsylvania may direct their Pennsylvania income tax payments to Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy.

How Does It Help?

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Many Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy students are in need of financial support for their Catholic education. Without this financial support, some students would not be able to attend Saint Joe's.

The EITC program enables individuals and businesses working in PA to direct their state income tax liability to Saint Joe's, so that these funds can be used for need-based student scholarships. As an added benefit, in some cases participation in the EITC program can help individuals and businesses reduce their own PA income tax liability.

Who can participate?

• Individuals or businesses with a PA Tax Liability of at least \$3,500 may qualify to participate. See your latest Form PA-40 Line 12 for your PA Tax Liability amount.

• For individuals or couples (married filing jointly), one must work for a business, own a business or own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. Individuals may live outside of PA and still participate if they own such stock. You must have PA State Tax Liability.

• Retirees must own a small business (receive an annual K-1 form) or work for a business (receive and annual W-2 form) or own stock in a company that does business in the state of PA. Some retirees qualify due to side jobs or residual ownership of businesses and some do not. We can work with you to confirm qualification status. Retirees may live outside of PA and still participate if they own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. You must have PA State Tax Liability.

Name a Scholarship at Saint Joe's!

Named scholarships benefit qualifying Saint Joseph's students. To establish a Named Scholarship, a commitment of \$500 or more for a minimum of three consecutive years is required. This allows the donor(s) to work with the school to create the scholarship in their name or the name of someone they wish to honor.

With a named scholarship, your entire contribution is awarded each year to a qualified student. Without this support, some students would not be able to financially attend Saint Joe's.

Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy will recognize the Named Scholarship Program donors at a yearly event. This event will provide the opportunity for our

thoughtful and generous benefactors to meet their scholarship recipient(s) and for our student scholarship awardees to personally thank the individual or family for their commitment and support of their Catholic education.
