## **Department Feature**

At Saint Joseph's, we strive every day to prepare students for academic success in college. The Theology Department challenges students to think deeply about faith, to pursue substantial answers to difficult questions, and to immerse themselves in the rich intellectual tradition of the Church. Through a variety of courses, students become familiar with a wide range of topics and are equipped to explain and defend the faith as they go out into the world. Beginning with the classical definition of Theology as "faith seeking understanding," the department hopes to lead students into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ and knowledge of Divine Revelation. We keep in mind the words of Pope Benedict XVI: "Our starting point is a person, not a program."

#### **Great Adventure Timeline**

Freshmen begin their course of study with a year that focuses on Sacred Scripture. They are aided by the Great Adventure Bible Timeline. The Great Adventure Bible Timeline divides salvation history into twelve distinct eras, punctuated by seventy key events. Using the Timeline helps students to see the underlying narrative that runs through Scripture. Far from being a confusing jumble of stories, the Bible tells a story: the story of God's covenant family.

#### Model Church Simulation

Sophomores spend the spring semester exploring ecclesiology, the study of the Church. For part of this course, students engage in the "Model Church" simulation. The Model Church was inspired by the Model UN, a popular simulation of the United Nations General Assembly. In the Model Church, each student role plays as the bishop of the diocese of their choice. After designing their episcopal coat of arms, the new bishops research their dioceses to learn about their flocks. As the simulation continues, the bishops become members of the various congregations of the Roman Curia, a College of Cardinals is appointed, and those cardinals meet in Conclave to elect a pope. The simulation culminates with the bishops and cardinals gathering with the pope to hold an Ecumenical Council. The simulation allows students to engage with the structure of the Church and explore the roles of bishops, cardinals, and popes.

## Senior Sam Yangula has been recognized as October's Student of the month.



This is an award voted on by teachers each month that highlights an outstanding student. An astute student, Sam especially loves computer science and history classes. Although he puts in exemplary work as a student, outside of the classroom he enjoys hunting and karate. Additionally, Sam is a member of the Saint Joe's soccer team.

Fall sports are wrapping up and we have exciting news to share.

The Boys & Girls Cross Country teams will be in action on 10/30 at the District 6 championships held at the Indian Valley Elementary School in Reedsville.

The Golf team (Dmitri Cornali, Juneon Park, Timothy Peters, Chris Warner) advanced to the District 6 AA championships and placed 3<sup>rd</sup> overall. Tim shot a 75 (+3) on the day to win the District 6 AA Individual championship. Peters' win earned him a trip to the state championships at Heritage Hills Golf Resort (York, PA). Tim shot a 76 (+5) on the day to earn him a share of 6<sup>th</sup> place and a medal. Tim becomes the second state medalist in team history. Coach Walsh had the following to say about the golf team's finish, "I'm proud of the team for their effort this year. I cannot thank the rest of the coaching staff, Garrett Bastardi and Matt Graham, enough for the time and talent they have given this group, it has been such a blessing to have two talented and committed coaches on the staff." He continued, "The alumni are always a great support for our current team and the highlight of the year is obviously the incredible, consistent and unrelenting work that Tim puts into his game, paying off with a couple dominant postseason performances, and finishing higher than any golfer in our program's history with his 6th place medal. The future for Saint Joe's golf is looking bright, and we will continue to build on the tradition of success and dedication to improvement."

The Soccer team will be heading into postseason play during the week of 10/25. Exact date to be determined as we await final standings.

The Girls Volleyball team will not be heading into the postseason, however, the young team (11 freshman & sophomores), led by 3 seniors battled all season. The team learned, grew, and developed a strong foundation by competing in three prestigious volleyball tournaments this season while ending with a regular season match record of 5-8. The future is looking bright for the girls' volleyball team and we are excited to see what they do on the hardwood next season.

#### Turn Your Pennsylvania Tax Payments Into Scholarships for Saint Joe's Students – Time is Running Out to Participate in the Fall 2021 Cycle – Contact Us Now to See if Tax Credits Still Remain!

Through this program businesses and individuals working in Pennsylvania may direct their Pennsylvania income tax payments to Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy.

#### How Does It Help?

Many Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy students are in need of financial support for their Catholic education. Without this financial support, some students would not be able to attend Saint Joe's.

The EITC program enables individuals and businesses working in PA to direct their state income tax liability to Saint Joe's, so that these funds can be used for need-based student scholarships. As an added benefit, in some cases participation in the EITC program can help individuals and businesses reduce their own PA income tax liability.

#### Who can participate?

'Individuals or businesses with a PA Tax Liability of at least \$3,500 may qualify to participate. See your latest Form PA-40 Line 12 for your PA Tax Liability amount.

For individuals or couples (married filing jointly), one must work for a business,

own a business or own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. Individuals may live outside of PA and still participate if they own such stock. You must have PA State Tax Liability.

Retirees must own a small business (receive an annual K-1 form) or work for a business (receive and annual W-2 form) or own stock in a company that does business in the state of PA. Some retirees qualify due to side jobs or residual ownership of businesses and some do not. We can work with you to confirm qualification status. Retirees may live outside of PA and still participate if they own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. You must have PA State Tax Liability.

#### Name a Scholarship at Saint Joe's!

Named scholarships benefit qualifying Saint Joseph's students. To establish a Named Scholarship, a commitment of \$500 or more for a minimum of three consecutive years is required. This allows the donor(s) to work with the school to create the scholarship in their name or the name of someone they wish to honor.

With a named scholarship, your entire contribution is awarded each year to a qualified student. Without this support, some students would not be able to financially attend Saint Joe's.

Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy will recognize the Named Scholarship Program donors at a yearly event. This event will provide the opportunity for our thoughtful and generous benefactors to meet their scholarship recipient(s) and for our student scholarship awardees to personally thank the individual or family for their commitment and support of their Catholic education.

Aidan is a current sophomore at the University of St. Thomas in St. Paul, Minnesota. St. Thomas is a university of over 10,000 plus students with three campuses located in St. Paul, Minneapolis, and Rome. The university offers more than 150+ undergraduate majors and minors and more than 55 graduate degrees. St. Thomas has recently transitioned from a division III school to a division I NCAA institution. This has been an exciting part of Aidan's experience so far at St. Thomas as he is highly involved in working and volunteering in the athletic department outside of his studies. Aidan chose to be "Tommie" because on his visit it really felt familiar and comfortable to him. He appreciates the smaller classes which provides direct access to professors and how he has been able to be involved in campus life. Aidan relayed that being a Tommie for life is a genuine part of being a student and alumnus at St. Thomas.

Aidan is currently studying Electrical Engineering with a minor in Business Administration. He is weighing his options toward careers in Sales Engineering, Medical Technology Sales, Research & Development, or potentially adjusting his major to focus more on the business side of things. Over the summer, while Aidan was home, he worked at Harpers downtown State College. He learned a lot in the sales world and really appreciated his experience working there. Aidan made quality connections and really enjoyed talking to people in the sales world.

It was great to hear how much Aidan is involved in the life of the university through several roles. He works in the gym facility on campus where he does many jobs such as checking people in or helping clean the strength & conditioning equipment. Aidan works many hours in the athletics ticket office selling tickets at games. He is also volunteering as a practice player for the women's basketball team this year in a new venture. Academically, Aidan is a member of the Engineering Students Alumni Mentoring (ESAM) group. He is a member of the LEAD Club which focuses on professional development and leadership development for students.
