# Saint Joseph's Inducts the first Hall of Fame Class



Saint Joseph's alumni Carrie Shearer (2015) and Garrett Bastardi (2015) have been named to Saint Joseph's inaugural Hall of Fame.

Saint Joseph's Hall of Fame recognizes Saint Joe's graduates or special

contributors who have helped define and advance the Saint Joseph's mission and pillars of faith, scholarship, leadership, and service through their post-graduate achievements and/or contributions. Jennifer Mallett, Head of School, views the Hall of Fame inductions as important because "they connect the past with the present. For a school that was opened 10 years ago, the Hall of Fame nominations and induction recognizes the best of the best while giving current students and families a blueprint for success."

Both Bastardi and Shearer described this honor as "humbling." Bastardi credits "the school and the community" for positively impacting his life and helping him to achieve this honor. He has taken the four pillars instilled to him at Saint Joe's and used them as the foundation for his life. Specifically, Bastardi has lived out the pillar of leadership by giving back to the very community that helped shape him. "I've lived out the pillar of leadership in my role as a coach and trying to do what I can to help young people not only reach their goals athletically, but also do so with gratitude and understanding that it's our Heavenly Father that gives us the opportunity to compete and learn."

Coaching basketball and golf at Our Lady of Victory and Saint Joseph's since 2018, Bastardi has had the opportunity to coach dozens of kids grades 6-12. "This role as a coach has provided me with the opportunity to lead and be a positive influence on a younger generation whose shoes I was just in not too long ago. I believe that advancing these four pillars on the court and/or out on the field of play is just as important as advancing the pillars in the classroom."

In addition to playing basketball and golf at Saint Joe's, Bastardi was also a member of Saint Joe's Student Council. Since high school graduation, he studied both Political Science and Meteorology at Penn State in addition to playing golf professionally for four years (2017-2021). In early 2021, Bastardi founded and began running a business in the golf and turfgrass management industry.

Shearer has also lived out Saint Joe's pillars since graduation. "Faith, scholarship, leadership, and service were not only guiding principles during my years in high school, but have also proven to align with my personal values as I continue life after graduation." Shearer graduated from Duquesne University Honors College (2019) and pursued a career in college sports and football operations. "While in college at Duquesne, I became greatly involved in campus ministry and a local church in the Pittsburgh area as a young adult/college ministry group leader." Her time as a ministry group leader has helped Shearer "to continue to put faith first in life, but also reinforced my passion for helping others to be intentional about living their faith every day."


After graduating from Duquesne, shearer became a full-time postgraduate intern at the NCAA National Office in Indianapolis as well as at Women Leaders in College Sports in Kansas City. "Those roles allowed me to work with the Big Ten Conference Office for two of their championships, and countless other opportunities that have shaped the leader I have become. Currently, I am working with the Carolina Panthers as the Football Operations Training Camp Intern and am looking forward to returning to the NCAA in September." As Shearer moves into a professional career working in the NFL and professional sports, she notes that "those guiding pillars remain just as applicable to life and work."

Shearer noted that "The significance and meaning of this award is not lost on

me, because I know that I would not be currently working my dream job and proud of where I am today if it were not for the people at Saint Joe's who invested their faith and time in me." While at Saint Joe's, Shearer was an active member of the community. She was involved in the following clubs and activities: Youth Group, Student Council, Yearbook, Football Team Manager, Basketball Team Manager, Prom Committee, and Accreditation Committee.

Both Bastardi and Shearer have left a lasting impact at Saint Joe's and will continue to live out the school's mission while having positively impacting their communities. Susan Robinson Fruchtl, Director of Development, summed the honor up saying, "There is no better way to recognize how our inductees exemplify our Four Pillars of Faith, Scholarship, Leadership, and Service in their daily lives. The science department at St Joseph's Catholic Academy is a place where you can find your niche in the science world. Students have a number of different avenues they can explore within the world of science.

Freshman take biology their first year to get their science experience started. In this class, students will be asked to view the living world through a more scientific lens in order to understand how living organisms interact and how they are made.

Students use their foundational skills learned from biology to take chemistry in their sophomore year. In 10th grade students will be able to think about how atoms are constructed.

Juniors take a physics course that ties chemistry into physics. In this class, students will be able to find out how matter interacts with one another.

Seniors have a wide range of classes to choose from as they finish their high school science career. These classes include Anatomy, Environmental Science, AP Chemistry, AP Physics, Computer Science, and Engineering.


The ideal class sizes at Saint Joe's enable students to succeed and thrive in the classroom. Students are able to get more one-on-one help when completing labs, researching projects, and engaging in group work. We are able to help students grow and develop in their high school science career within the Research and Design class. In this class students are able to create their own hypothesis, test this hypothesis, collect data, analyze findings, and draw conclusions. Students then take their findings and compete in Pennsylvania Junior Academy of Science state competition; where we have had countless students succeed. This event allows for a lot of new doors to be opened for students across the state.

Within our wide selection of science classes we are able to take the nature of the courses, teach successful methods of processing information, instill problem solving skills, and help grow a better understanding of how the world around us works even if we can not see it with the naked eye. Every year we are able to build off previous ideas to make the students walking out of Saint Joseph's well-rounded in all aspects of science, and ready to take on any science related task the world has to offer. We in the science department teach the mind to think rather than the learning of facts.

# Members of the Pack Attend Leadership Collaborative By: Chad Walsh

Ms. Stoicheff and I had the opportunity to do something that very few of us have had the ability to do over the past couple school years, get our students out on a real-life fieldtrip! The pandemic has made us suspend some of those traditions that make up a teaching and learning community, the things that bring energy and life to our faculty, staff, and



students. So, traveling to another school, working with other educators, seeing other students was just what we needed... an absolutely energizing experience.

Ms. Stoicheff brought the idea to the faculty a few weeks ago, and as she described the mission and her experience with the program, I couldn't wait to get some of our students there! So, with the blessing of the administration, and support of the board. We loaded up the Fullington van with seven students and headed to Warrior Run High School to take part in a leadership seminar hosted by Jostens Renaissance Education Program. The Renaissance program is committed to helping schools renew their culture and climate by working with administration, educators, and especially student leaders. The program was free and attended by 15+ schools with over 200 students in attendance, Saint Joe's getting the day's award for furthest distance traveled.

Members of House Council invited underclassman (not in House Council) to attend the seminar, which was just over three hours long, and led by teacher, coach, athletic director and principal from Tennessee, Dr. Philip "PC" Campbell. In the end, we had three seniors, a junior, a sophomore, and two freshmen with us, and each of our four houses were represented, with the hope that these students would bring some ideas and energy back to their classes and houses, as we continue to build our school's culture.

The students were given opportunities to discuss leadership experiences, new ideas and areas of improvement with peers from other districts. The morning was filled with interactive and energizing activities, culminating in a fast-paced slide show from Dr. Campbell outlining over 100 different ideas to help bolster school culture. Our seven students each brought notebooks, and as I looked over their shoulders 10-15 minutes into the event, most already had taken about a half-page of notes, without any instruction from either Ms. Stoicheff or me. To say that PC knows how to engage students (and educators, for that matter) was apparent, and it is easy to see why there is so much momentum behind the Renaissance Education Program. Our students genuinely seemed to enjoy getting to interact, collaborate and brainstorm with peers.

With a focus on enhancing our student body's culture, and shift in focus on the house system, we thought it was important to see the buy-in from our students this year, and they have stepped up in so many ways. This opportunity will only add to that, and I am convinced that these seven students will share their experience with classmates and housemates in order to strengthen our already strong sense of community through the traditions we've created, and also by bringing some new traditions into the fold. It was a great day, an energizing day, and will undoubtedly set us up with more great days to come at Saint Joe's.

Turn Your Pennsylvania Tax Payments Into Scholarships for Saint Joe's Students – Time is Running Out to Participate in the Fall 2021 Cycle – Contact Us Now to See if Tax Credits Still Remain!

Through this program businesses and individuals working in Pennsylvania may direct their Pennsylvania income tax payments to Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy.

## How Does It Help?

Many Saint Joseph's Catholic Academy students are in need of financial support for their Catholic education. Without this financial support, some students would not be able to attend Saint Joe's.

The EITC program enables individuals and businesses working in PA to direct their state income tax liability to Saint Joe's, so that these funds can be used for need-based student scholarships. As an added benefit, in some cases participation in the EITC program can help individuals and businesses reduce their own PA income tax liability.

## Who can participate?

• Individuals or businesses with a PA Tax Liability of at least \$3,500 may qualify to participate. See your latest Form PA-40 Line 12 for your PA Tax Liability amount.

- For individuals or couples (married filing jointly), one must work for a business, own a business or own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. Individuals may live outside of PA and still participate if they own such stock. You must have PA State Tax Liability.
- Retirees must own a small business (receive an annual K-1 form) or work for a business (receive and annual W-2 form) or own stock in a company that does business in the state of PA. Some retirees qualify due to side jobs or residual ownership of businesses and some do not. We can work with you to confirm qualification status. Retirees may live outside of PA and still participate if they own stock in a company that does business in the state of Pennsylvania. You must have PA State Tax Liability.

## Name a Scholarship at Saint Joe's!

Named scholarships benefit qualifying Saint Joseph's students. To establish a Named Scholarship, a commitment of \$500 or more for a minimum of three consecutive years is required. This allows the donor(s) to work with the school to create the scholarship in their name or the name of someone they wish to honor.

With a named scholarship, your entire contribution is awarded each year to a qualified student. Without this support, some students would not be able to financially attend Saint Joe's.


## Talk a little about your college experience:
