# Fresh Faces: An Interview With New Athletic Director Bryce King

**Meet St. Joseph's new Athletic Director, Mr. Bryce King!** King grew up in Silver Springs, Maryland, where he was all-state first chair for saxophone and played basketball. He ultimately decided to pursue his education at Penn State, starting out in architecture, before

realizing his true calling. "I knew I loved the game of basketball. I had a job in college where I was really good at sales as well. I can talk, I'm a talker, right? So ultimately I decided to myself that my future is going to be making positive impressions on people through these outlets." This dream led King to start out as a sales intern at Enterprise Rent-a-Car, where he notes he learned his most valuable lessons in human connection, communication, and conversation. He moved into a remote IT job during COVID and got married in 2022.



With the birth of his first child in 2023, and news that his job was being outsourced, King had to make a decision. "I ran it by my wife and said, 'You know what, I'm already coaching AAU basketball, but I want to make this my everything. I don't want to answer to anyone ever again if I don't have to. I want to do something that makes me wake up and smile every day." Building off of his experience in AAU basketball, King started Team Lockdown LLC, a basketball skills training program, in partnership with C3 Sports. As his business grew, parents reached out to him and told him he should become an athletic director.

What made him decide Saint Joe's? The student section. King specifically remembers the day he stopped by for the girls' basketball playoff game versus Williamsburg. "I was not expecting to see the student section the way they were," he recalls. "The grandiose entrance and starting lineups, with the lights flickering and smoke. It was raucous in there, an environment I hadn't seen in high school in a very long time."

The second he saw the student section, King wanted to be a part of St. Joe's. He wants to make an impact and really emphasize the role of student-athlete, and for all sports, not just the popular ones. "I want smoke machines for golf and cross country. I want us to feel like the best athletes in the world at our age in amateur high school sports. So that's the goal."

On his goals for the future, King recognizes how St. Joe's already has the fun part down— but discipline, respect, and communication are also needed in student-athletes. First and foremost, their academics comes first. "Winning is great. But we're also building young men and young women who could be winners in life. Playing basketball, playing soccer, or playing whatever sports they are playing right now could be a footnote to who they become and their future. These kids might look back and say, 'I may never play soccer again in my life, but I had the best time of my life during that time.' And part of my job is to make sure that that happens."
